Other items:

1. A WRBP forcemain leak in Laconia on 3/11/2018 was caused from corrosion from the outside of the ductile iron pipeline.
2. A manhole SSO in Belmont reported on 3/31/18 occurred due to personal care product debris clogging a WRBP siphon. The WRBP and Belmont are coordinating outreach education activities in the immediate area.
