The WRBP extended the EST contract to 2020 including a trial at 3 locations for 3-months.	The 3 trial flow meters were not definitively more accurate or precise than the installed meters. Alternatives are being evaluated.

Asset Management/ Collection System Evaluations initiative	The WRBP purchased software & implementation support for \$105,100. The Keene site visit on 1/17/18 provided lessons learned.	\$125K budget for W-P the combined asset management and collection system assessment task orders. An SRF loan for \$30K/phase for 3 phases has been approved.	Data gathering and work order utilization is on-going. A training session on GIS capabilities is scheduled for 3/1/19.
WRBP Infrastructure Ownership/Responsibilities	Belmont, Northfield, DAS, Gilford and Tilton Executed MOAs with DES. MOAs for Bay District, Sanbornton, Meredith, and Laconia are under review. Franklin meeting held on 5/8/18; with revisions pending.	NH AG's costs are assessed to the WRBP operating budget. Governance Work Plan	The work plan to evaluate alternative governance structures for the WRBP was approved at the 10/2/2016 Advisory Board meeting. The legal firm presented their roadmap at the July 2018 meeting; the Advisory Board members approved starting the Phase I efforts.	DES responded to the Gilford letter requesting clarification regarding ownership transfer of assets on 1/25/2017. Laconia escrow agreement will collect funds for the study with an initial budget of \$50K this year and \$50K next year.	The Governance group engaged legal assistance to evaluate next steps to get to a decision point on governance options. DES' 11/8/18 response to the Phase I Roadmap presentation held at DES on 9/28/18 was discussed at the November meeting. The Board's response to DES dated 12/20/18 is under review. Rate Assessment Formula	DES' preliminary analysis of the relative contribution of flow, strength and capacity (shared) costs presented on 5/5/2016. The Advisory Board resolved to have a draft formula by 1/1/2019; the workgroup met on 7/25/18 and 8/16/18. Conference call with Bay District member and metering consultant on 9/26/18.	The full Advisory Board has expressed interest in participating in this discussion with DES regarding a draft rate formula. Updated flow and capacity information prepared by DES was presented to the rate assessment workgroup on 8/16/18. A Flow Metering Rate Allocation study task order was finalized on 1/22/19 for the four southern members where current measured flow data is not accurate enough for billing.	DES presented preliminary flow and capacity findings from the 3 rd party flow metering evaluations at the March 2017 Advisory Board meeting. DES presented a table of WRBP Franklin WWTP Capacity Status at the July 2017 meeting. <i>Consultant is gathering GIS and connection data from the southern 4 communities as part of the study.</i>
Replacement Fund (Reserve Account) Legislation	The Advisory Board is working with DES to amending RSA:485-A:51 for the 2018-2019 session. Draft discussed at 9/20/18 and 10/18/18 Advisory Board meetings and sponsors are being sought.	The House bill to create a Reserve Account and clarify the assessment and use of this Fund was retained, then deemed ITL last session and is not being pursued this session given the recommendations of the Advisory Board.	SB468-FN that would have redirect fines to the general fund and was referred to interim study committee that recommended ITL on 9/13/18; executive session on 10/10/18 did not recommend approval.
Commercial Discharge Permit (CDP) Initiative	Information workshop on 2/21/2018 was attended by representatives from 7 member communities. Workshop #2 was held on 5/8/18. Laconia DPW met with WRBP on 3/28/18.	Member communities and the WRBP will coordinate priorities and collaboratively develop lists of firms to be contacted about permitting. <i>Current priorities are dental offices, food service establishments and facilities with regulated waste disposal.</i>	CDP Initiative will involve various municipal officials and departments and the WRBP. <i>18 new CDPs were issued in 2018, another 34 have already been issued in 2019, 19 are under review and 87 are in-progress.</i>
WRBP Rule-Making	A Rule-making preliminary meeting was held 5/8/18; draft provided to all members on 5/17/18, work group met 7/5/18.	Rule-making is in progress with member community input to clarify definitions and permitting processes. Final proposal will incorporate additional amendments.	Initial proposal to readopt with amendment submitted to Water Council and LBA. Public meeting on 11/16/18. <i>JLCAR meeting on Rules is scheduled for March 15, 2019.</i>


