<b>Minor Projects</b> <i>quantity disturbed ≤ 1 m<sup>3</sup> or 15 m<sup>2</sup>;  (ref. Env-Sw 2102.17)</i>				
<b>Emergency Projects, per Env-Sw 2102.12</b>	Person performing work must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>be a qualified individual (see Env-Sw 2102.20)</li> <li>be trained and certified per Env-A 1812, unless the work is a license-exempt small scale/short duration project<sup>1</sup> or license-exempt surface scrap removal project<sup>2</sup>. (Note: the number of certified experienced workers at the site must equal or exceed the number of certified workers-in-training).</li> <li>work under a licensed entity or individual, unless the work is a license-exempt small scale/short duration project<sup>1</sup>, license-exempt surface scrap removal project, or license-exempt single family homeowner self-implemented project<sup>3</sup></li> </ul>	No written work plan required	<u>Who:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local Health Officer</li> <li>NH Dept. of Environmental Services, Air Division(DES-Air)</li> <li><u>How &amp; When:</u> Verbal notice as soon as practicable under the circumstances, followed within 48 hours by written confirmation</li> </ul> <u>Exceptions:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>For license-exempt small scale/short duration projects, notify the Local Health Officer before starting the work (ref. Env-A 1811).</li> <li>For license-exempt surface scrap removal projects, there is no notice requirement.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Site owner must maintain complete project records.</li> <li>If disposal area is reconfigured, submit as-built drawing to DES-Waste within 60 days of project completion.</li> <li>Maintain waste shipment records per 40 CFR 61 &amp; 49 CFR 171-172.</li> </ul>
<b>Non-Emergency Projects</b>			<u>Who:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local Health Officer</li> <li>NH Dept. of Environmental Services, Air Division (DES-Air)</li> </ul> <u>How &amp; When:</u> Verbal or written notice as soon as practicable after knowing work involves asbestos. If verbal, provide written notice within 48 hours thereafter	
<b>Major Projects</b> <i>quantity disturbed &gt;1 m<sup>3</sup> or 15 m<sup>2</sup>  (ref. Env-Sw 2102.16)</i>				
<b>Emergency Projects, per Env-Sw 2102.12</b>	Person performing work must: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>be a qualified individual (see Env-Sw 2102.20).</li> <li>be trained and certified per Env-A 1812, unless the work is a license exempt surface scrap removal project<sup>2</sup> (Note: the number of certified experienced workers at the site must equal or exceed the number of certified workers-in-training).</li> <li>work under a licensed entity or individual, unless the work is a license-exempt surface scrap removal project, or license-exempt single family homeowner self-implemented project.</li> </ul>	No written work plan required	<u>Who:</u> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Local Health Officer</li> <li>NH Dept. of Environmental Services, Air Division (DES-Air)</li> <li>NH Dept. of Environmental Services, Waste Division (DES-Waste)</li> </ul> <u>How &amp; When:</u> Verbal notice as soon as practicable under the circumstances, followed within 48 hours by written confirmation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Site owner must maintain complete project records.</li> <li>If disposal area is reconfigured, submit as-built drawing to DES-Waste within 60 days of project completion.</li> <li>Maintain waste shipment records per 40 CFR 61 &amp; 49 CFR 171-172.</li> <li>If project takes over 2 weeks, submit weekly progress reports to DES-Waste and local health officer.</li> <li>Within 60 days of completion, submit project completion report to DES-Waste and Local Health Officer.</li> </ul>
<b>Non-Emergency Projects</b>			<u>Exception:</u> No notice is required for surface scrap removal projects.	

<sup>1</sup> License-exempt small scale/short duration projects involve the disturbance of less than one cubic foot and 3 square feet of asbestos waste, completed within 2 hours of being initiated. The work can not be part of a larger project that is being segmented into several small scale, short duration tasks. See Env-A 1811.03(c) for additional detail.

<sup>2</sup> License-exempt surface scrap removal projects involve the removal of non-friable asbestos ONLY from the ground surface to a container for disposal at an authorized facility in accordance with Env-Sw 901. The work does not involve excavation below the ground surface or contact with friable asbestos. See Env-A 1811.03(d)

<sup>3</sup> License-exempt homeowner self-implemented projects involve the disturbance of an asbestos disposal site by the owner of a single-family, owner occupied residence, on the property where that residence is located. See Env-A 1811.03(b). Note: The property owner is exempt from having to work under the authority of a license, but is NOT exempt from having to be trained and certified pursuant to Env-A 1812.
