Pollution Prevention...

...is any activity that reduces or eliminates the <u>creation</u> of waste at its <u>point of generation</u>, usually within the manufacturing process.

Don't make the waste in the first place!

Inefficiency = Waste = \$

- Hazardous Waste
- Solid (non-hazardous) Waste
- Air Emissions
- Water Discharges
- Heat
- Fuel
- Time

Efficiency

- Is your process inefficient?
 - "Keep doing what you've been doing, and you keep getting what you've been getting"
 - Does the process require more material, energy or time than needed?
 - SOP reviews
 - Staff
 - Are they doing what they're supposed to?
 - SOP reviews
 - Changing their attitudes

Efficiency

- Are your input materials efficient?
 - Non-hazardous/toxic/regulated materials
 - Less hazardous/toxic/regulated materials
 - Use less stuff!

- 1. Get organized
 - Is management on board?
 - Be a champion!
 - Form a planning team
 - Differing personalities is good!
 - Seek input from everyone. Be a good listener.

- 2. Analyze Processes
 - Map out the steps. Look critically at every one.
 - Dissect each step. Pinpoint where materials are used and wastes generated.
 - Calculate <u>true</u> costs of waste generation.
 - Target your efforts based on highest costs.

- 3. Identify Alternatives
 - Determine factors responsible for waste
 - Get creative. List as many alternatives as possible for reducing costs
 - group brainstorming,
 - employee incentives,
 - or outside assistance

- 4. Evaluate alternatives
 - Start with the low hanging fruit
 - Study the feasibility of more complicated options
 - Effectiveness (how much do we save?)
 - Executability (how easy is it to do?)
 - Cost (how expensive is this?)

- 5. Implement Projects
 - Schedule projects
 - Assign responsibilities
 - Communicate with those who will be affected by changes. Include them in process.
 - Get feedback to work out the bugs

- 6. Measure Progress
 - Track:
 - Waste generation
 - Material usage
 - Cost savings
 - Document results
 - Celebrate!

16. Generator's Certification:

"I am a large quantity generator, I certify that I have a program in place to reduce the volume and toxicity of waste generated to the degree I have determined to be economically practicable and that I selected practicable method of treatment, storage, or disposal currently available to me which minimizes the present and future threat to human health and the environment."
