## **Hazardous Waste Generator Classification**

#### Small Quantity Generator (SQG) v. Full Quantity Generator (FQG)

Requirements pertaining to the handling of hazardous wastes are dependent on the quantity of hazardous waste generated during a specific time period. Generators of hazardous waste are placed in 1 of 3 classes: SQG, SQG Extended Storage and FQG.

### **Training**

Generator Status	Training Requirements
SQG	None
SQG Extended Storage	All employees must be thoroughly familiar with proper waste handling and emergency procedures relevant to their responsibilities.
FQG	FQGs must provide personnel training in hazardous waste management by an outside trainer or adequately trained in-house employee. Employees must be trained within 6 months of employment or reassignment; employees must not work unsupervised until they have completed the training. Employees must receive training annually. A FQG must maintain the following documents on-site: Job title and name of employee filling that position for each position related to hazardous waste management, written job descriptions, a written description of the type and amount of training each employee receives, records that document that the required training has been completed, training records must be kept until facility closure or three years on former employees.

#### **Contingency Plan**

Full Quantity Generators are required to have a contingency plan for their facility. The contingency plan must be implemented immediately whenever there is a fire, explosion, or release of hazardous waste or hazardous waste constituents which could threaten human health or the environment.

The contingency plan must describe the actions facility personnel must take in response to fires, explosions or releases. The contents of the contingency plan must be as described in 40 CFR 265.52 and must comply with 40 CFR 265.51 and 40 CFR 265.56.
