Dear Governor Benson:

On March 7, 2003, the Office of Ocean and Coastal Resource Management (OCRM) received your request for approval of the New Hampshire inland coastal boundary as an amendment to New Hampshire's federally approved coastal zone management program. OCRM congratulates the New Hampshire Coastal Program (NHCP) on its completion of this challenging effort to expand the inland coastal boundary.

OCRM has reviewed your request and determined, as a preliminary matter, that the NHCP would remain approvable, pursuant to section 306(d) of the Coastal Zone Management Act (CZMA), if amended to include the expanded inland coastal boundary. In addition, OCRM has determined that its final approval of the expanded coastal boundary would be a substantial change to the NHCP and requires OCRM to determine, pursuant to the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA), if our approval would be a major federal action which may have a significant effect on the human environment. Therefore, OCRM will prepare an Environmental Assessment (EA) in compliance with the NEPA requirements. Pursuant to section 306(e) of the CZMA, OCRM has determined it necessary to extend the review period for New Hampshire's request for a period of at least 120 days in order to complete the EA. In the event additional time is necessary to meet NEPA requirements, OCRM may extend the review period further.
