Black Heritage Trail of NH Basement Flooding Investigations

Recipient:	Black Heritage Trail of New Hampshire Inc.
Description:	The goal of this project is to determine the extent to which the basement flooding of the Black Heritage Trail of New Hampshire headquarters at 222 Court Street is caused by groundwater encroachment exacerbated by sea-level rise.

Beginning with an Alternatives Analysis at the Pit Lane Crossing in New Castle to Promote Better Connections for Tidal and Freshwater Wetlands

Recipient:	Rockingham County Conservation District
Description:	The goal of this project is to address the resiliency of this significant area where several freshwater wetlands interconnect with Lavenger Creek salt marsh. This will be accomplished with an alternative analysis and preliminary design for the crossing at Pit Lane, while also considering possible future modifications to Route 1B. This project seeks to maximize the benefits of regular tidal exchange and habitat connectivity, while minimizing risks to property and infrastructure.
