6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments including whether the rule implements a state statute for the first time:

The Department of Environmental Services is proposing to readopt Env-A 4800, Carbon Dioxide (CO₂) Allowance Auction Program, without any changes.

The chapter is based on the Regional Greenhouse Gas Initiative (RGGI). RGGI is composed of individual CO2 Budget Trading Programs in each of the eleven RGGI participating states. Each participating state's CO2 Budget Trading Program is based on the 2008 RGGI Model Rule, which was developed to provide guidance to states as they implemented the RGGI program. RGGI participating states completed a 2012 program review and made amendments to the 2008 RGGI Model Rule which were finalized in February 2013. RGGI participating states completed another program review in 2017 which resulted in amendments to the RGGI Model Rule, finalized in December 2017.

No changes are needed to Env-A 4800 at this time.

These rules are due to expire on January 1, 2024. The existing rules are subject to extension for the duration of this readoption proceeding pursuant to RSA 541-A:14-a, I.
