- 6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The existing rules in Env-Dw 902 specify restrictions on certain activities in, upon, and within the watersheds of certain surface waters that are sources of public drinking water. The rules are proposed to be readopted with amendments in order to make clarifications and readopt the rules in advance of their expiration in 2024. The proposed amendments include a definition of "board of water commissioners" to accommodate the various persons and entities having authority over local water systems, and update incorporated statutory definitions.

6. (b) Brief description of the groups affected:

The rules will affect owners/operators of public water systems that use surface water as a source, as well as anyone who owns property or recreates adjacent to such surface waters.
