5. Short Title: Public Grants for Landfill and Incinerator Closure

6. (a) Summary of what the rule says and of any proposed amendments:

The purpose of the chapter is to implement RSA 149-M:41-50, which authorizes state grants to municipalities to assist with the costs of closing unlined solid waste landfills and certain incinerators. The rules specify the criteria and procedures by which NHDES determines whether costs incurred by a municipality are costs eligible for 20% reimbursement through issuance of a grant. All financial assistance to municipalities relating to this program is subject to the appropriation of funds by the Legislature.

The Department is proposing to readopt with amendment Env-Sw 1300, *Public Grants for Landfill and Incinerator Closure*. The proposed amendments clarify the existing rules. The existing rules will expire on July 1, 2024.

The proposed rules affect municipalities who apply for grants to close unlined landfills or incinerators.
