

TITLE I THE STATE AND ITS GOVERNMENT

CHAPTER 9-C STATE GOVERNMENT WASTE REDUCTION, RECYCLING, AND RECYCLED PRODUCTS PURCHASE

Section 9-C:1

9-C:1 Purpose. – State government has an obligation to put into practice, as part of its own operations, the interdependent principles of waste reduction, recycling, and recycled products purchase. State agencies shall strive to maximize the application of these principles in their normal operations. This chapter shall apply to all state agencies, as defined in RSA 9-C:2, V, whether or not they are required to make purchases through the division of procurement and support services in the department of administrative services.

The State's Reuse Facility

New Hampshire Surplus, commonly referred to as WHITE FARM E, serves as a repurposing center for state and federal surplus property. The nickname White Farm stems from the facility being located within a decommissioned dairy farm founded in 1846. Although the main building is in fact white, the moniker connects to the original owner, Nathaniel White, a man of historical significance to the State. White Farm was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1981. As part of its commitment to re-purposing goods as much as possible, the State uses White Farm's main complex and grounds to house recovered materials, for sale within the Retail Store and during Live and Online Auction cycles.

Retail Store

The retail store sells products repurposed from state property surplus and TSA airport programs. Products are displayed in three store areas. Common items for sale include furniture, tools, pocket knives, clothing/shoes/hats/belts, appliances, office supplies, equipment and electronics. Shoppers can expect to be amazed by the array of goods and one just never knows what treasures may be found! Cash or Visa/Mastercard/Discover with minimum \$10 purchase.

How to Acquire Surplus Federal Personal Property

Eligible state and local government agencies and nonprofit organizations can obtain personal property that the federal government no longer needs through the Federal Surplus Personal Property Donation Program.

Contact the Local State Agency for Surplus Property (SASP)

State agencies and public organizations seeking donations of surplus federal property should contact a <u>SASP representative</u> in their region. These state-run organizations coordinate with the federal program for the donation of federal surplus property to public, tax-supported entities and eligible private nonprofit tax-exempt organizations. SASPs evaluate all organizations and determine eligibility based on proof of eligibility through proper documentation. SASPs may provide search-only access for <u>the Personal Property</u>

<u>Management System</u> (PPMS), which is a web-enabled platform where eligible customers can search for and select personal property.

SASP representatives will guide eligible entities through the rest of the process.

Note: Most SASPs operate on a self-sustaining basis and may require recipients to pay a service charge to cover handling, transportation, and administrative expenses. These charges are partly based on percentages of the value of the property.






• The Vendor Resource page hosts the Online Vendor Registration for creating and maintaining a vendor account. There is also a page for the State of New Hampshire bids from the Bureau of Purchase and Property, along with bids from the Bureau of Graphic Services and well as bids and proposals from other agencies. These documents are available for download and submittal, and do not require a log on to access, nor any cost associated with the download or submittal




- The Bids page is an interactive online database, that is searchable, has bids, addendums, awards, etc. available to review and download since 2006
- The Bids page will open to all Bids that are currently open and available to download, and show a description of the Bid, including all relevant details
- Prior Bids can be searched for by Bid Number, Bid Description or other fields. Change the Status from Open to All, and then select the dates, commodity or a description and then hit the Search Button, and a return of Bids that meet your parameters will appear



- The Contracts page is an interactive online database, that is searchable, and has Notice of Contracts and Signed Contracts available for review and download
- The Contracts page will open to all Contracts that are currently active and available to download, and will show a description of the Contract, the Notice of Contract is in Adobe format, and is downloaded under the contract description, any attachments that pertain to that contract, and the effective start date and expiration date for the contract, the agency the contract is for, as well as the contact person for the contract and the vendor that provides the commodity/service
- The Contracts can be searched for by Contract Number, Contract Description, Vendor Name or other fields. Select the dates, agency or contact and then hit the Search Button, and a return of contracts that meet your parameters will appear
- The page also has a feature to allow an export of the results of searches (not the contract documents just the results as shown)



- You can reach our Contact Page at the top right of any of our web pages, and click the "Contact Us"
- This will bring you to a listing of the various Bureaus and Sections within the Division of Procurement and Support Services, along with the personnel, titles, phone and emails
- We also list the generic phone, fax and emails for questions that may arise

Tips and Things to Consider....

- ▶ **Think openly. Be Creative**: Grants may not clearly target solid waste get creative with thinking about how funding objectives can tie into solid waste.
- ▶ **Consider partnerships**: Appealing to funders. Non-profits and private businesses may be eligible for other grants that better align with your project.
- ▶ Will you need a consultant/engineer? See list of consultants provided.
 - ▶ Used by other SW facilities for monitoring, reporting, site design, etc.

DO YOUR OWN RESEARCH!

- NHDES has limited resources to help you select grants for your specific project.
- Talk to funders before you apply!
